image: the circuitry of a motherboard

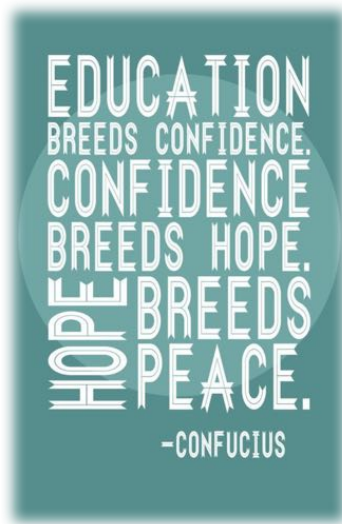
